22. OUR NATIONS FOUNDING

Forbid it almighty God. I know not what course others may take, but as for me, give me liberty, or give me death."

These sentences have been arased from aur taxthacks. Was Batrick Hanry a E-RFISHBH? THE BILLOWING VEBF: 14/8: HE WESTE THIS THE BIRLOWING BETHER BIR SEFSHELV or too often that this great Nation was founded not by religionists, but by Christians; not on religions, but on the Gospel of Jesus Christ. For that reason alone, people of other faiths have been afforded freedom of worship here."

Consider these words that Thomas Jefferson wrote on the front of his well-worn Bible: "I am a real Christian, that is to say, a disciple of the doctrines of Jesus. I have little doubt that our whole country will soon be rallied to the unity of our Creator. "He was also the chairman of the American Bible Society, which he considered his highest and most important role.

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On July 4, 1821, President Adams said, "The highest glory of the American Revolution was this: it connected in one indissoluble bond the principles of civil government with the principles of Christianity."

Calvin Coolidge, our 30th President of the United States reaffirmed this truth when he wrote, "The foundations of our society and our government rest so much on the teachings of the Bible that it would be difficult to support them if faith in these teaching would cease to be practically universal in our country."

In 1782 the United States Congress voted this resolution: "The congress of the United States recommends and approves the Holy Bible for use in all schools."

William Holmes McGuffey is the author of the Mcguffey Reader, which was used for over 100 years in our public schools with over 125 million copies sold until 1963. President Lincoln called him the "Schoolmaster of the nation." Listen to these words of Mr. McGuffery: "The Christian religion is the religion of our country. From it are derived our notions on the character of God, on the great moral Governor of the universe. On its doctrines are founded the peculiarities of our free institutions. From no source has the author drawn more conspicuously than from the sacred Scriptures. From all these extracts from the Bible I make no apology."

Of the first 108 universities founded in America, 106 were distinctly Christian, including the first, Harvard University, charted in 1636. In the original Harvard Student Handbook, rule number 1 was that students seeking entrance must know Latin and Greek so that they could study the scriptures: "Let every student be plainly instructed and earnestly pressed to consider well, the main end of this life and studies is, to know God and Jesus Christ, which is eternal life, John 17:3; and therefore to lay Jesus Christ as the only foundation for our children to follow the moral principles of the Ten Commandments.

James Madison, the primary author of the Constitution of the United States, said this: "We have staked the whole future of our new nation not upon the power of government; far from it. We have staked the future of all our political constitutions upon the capacity of each of ourselves to govern ourselves according to the moral principles of the Ten Commandments."

Today, we are asking God to bless America. But, how can he bless a Nation that had departed so far from Him? Prior to September 11, he was not welcome in America. "We walked until our shoes were worn out." She later wrote, "and our feet became sore and cracked open and bled until you could see the whole print of our feet with blood on the ground. We stopped and united in prayer to the Lord ... to heal our feet, and ... our feet were healed forthwith."

Jane would later make the long trek west, driven from Nauvoo by religious persecution. In 1847, as a pioneer in one of the first group of Mormons to head west she showed great courage as she walked across the plains to what would later be known as Utah. Life did not get easier in the Salt Lake Valley, a forsaken desert with no crops or civilization. "Oh how I suffered of cold and hunger and keenest of all was to hear my little ones crying for bread, and I had none to give them." Faith and hard work sustained her.

Her husband left her and her children in 1869, and didn't return until 20 years later. Undaunted, she kept a garden, sewed, made soap, and managed her family and home. She worked as a laundress to make money.

Throughout her life Jane Manning James retained a sense of personal worth and dignity, and was a great example of goodness and faith. —News and Feature Services.

She shared what little she had with her neighbors.
